Associate Head, LA presented the following proposal for establishing a Centre for Culture, Language, and Development Studies at IIT Bhilai.

Indian society and culture have a wealth of oral history, linguistic diversity, cultural pluralism, ecological wisdom, and collective memory. Considering this, the Department of Liberal Arts at IIT Bhilai proposes establishing a Centre for Culture, Language, and Development Studies. The Centre will aspire to position IIT Bhilai as a leading global center for excellence in research on pertinent issues of topical relevance to society.

It is envisaged that all personnel costs of the center will be met through third-party funding. This includes salaries/ honoraria for non-teaching staff appointed as project assistants/ associates and teaching staff appointed as visiting professors/ research fellows. The center will be housed in the Department of Liberal Arts building as proposed in Stage B, Phase 1 of the campus construction project. The Centre will require office space and cabins for visiting faculty and research fellows. The financial outflow from the institute will only be towards supporting essential office equipment and furniture for the center in the form of desktops, office tables, etc.

After deliberation, the Senate approved the proposal for establishing a Centre for Culture, Language, and Development Studies at IIT Bhilai and recommended to place it before the Board for consideration.

Six-Months Internship Policy

As part of a holistic education, NEP 2020 envisages students at all HEIs will be provided with opportunities for internships with local industry, businesses, artists, crafts persons, etc., as well as research internships with faculty and researchers at their own or other HEIs/research institutions, so that students may actively engage with the practical side of their learning and, as a by-product, further improve their employability. Although BTech students are allowed for internship work during their inter semester break, i.e., summer or winter break, they are unable to go for a full semester internship as the current BTech curriculum does not have any provision for that. Therefore, it is being proposed to allow all interested BTech students to opt for a six-month or full-semester internship in their 7th or 8th semester. In this regard, a policy is proposed as follows.

Policy:

- i. An internship is not mandatory and is purely an optional provision for BTech students.
- ii. BTech students with a CGPA ≥ 7 with no active backlogs be allowed a semester-long/six-month internship (internship duration should be at least four months and not more than six months) in their 7th or 8th Semester.
- iii. The student should not have taken any MOOC-based courses before opting for an internship.
- iv. Students should intimate their department about their willingness to take the internships before the start of the 7th semester.
- v. The Internship shall be open to Government research laboratories, reputed industries, and academia (in an IIT only).

Committee: There should be a committee in the department that will make decisions regarding internships. It should consist of at least 3 faculty members, with one faculty member from outside the department. This committee shall evaluate the internship work and grade with a letter grade as applicable for the BTech thesis. A minimum of one evaluation by the Departmental Committee is mandatory.

Curriculum: All the Departments have to relook at their BTech curriculum and suggest revisions in order to implement the above policy.

Note

1. In an asymptomatic patient, Non alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD) is the most common cause of increased AST, ALT levels. NAFLD is considered as hepatic manifestation of metabolic syndrome.
2. In most type of liver disease, ALT activity is higher than that of AST; exception may be seen in Alcoholic Hepatitis, Hepatic Cirrhosis, and Liver neoplasia. In a patient with Chronic liver disease, AST:ALT ratio>1 is highly suggestive of advanced liver fibrosis.
3. In known cases of Chronic Liver disease due to Viral Hepatitis B & C, Alcoholic liver disease or NAFLD, Enhanced liver fibrosis (ELF) test may be used to evaluate liver fibrosis.
4. In a patient with Chronic Liver disease, AFP and Des-gamma carboxyprothrombin (DCP)/PIVKA II can be used to assess risk for development of Hepatocellular Carcinoma.

In anaemic conditions Mentzer index is used to differentiate Iron Deficiency Anaemia from Beta- Thalassemia trait. If Mentzer Index value is >13, there is probability of Iron Deficiency Anaemia. A value <13 indicates likelihood of Beta- Thalassemia trait and Hb HPLC is advised to rule out the Thalassemia trait.
